


Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 MPZ6 - Cairns

1. The purpose of this map is to help interpret the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003. The zone boundaries shown on this map are indicative only. While care has been taken to illustrate zone boundaries as accurately as possible, users must refer to Schedule 1 to the "Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003" for precise boundary descriptions.

2. Zone identifiers indicate the zone type, latitude and number of each zoned area. Zones numbered on this map:

4. Reefs, shoals and islands within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park are numbered west to east within one-degree bands. They are prefixed with the latitude at the top of the band in which they lie. A centre point is used to determine the appropriate one-degree band for features straddling parallels.


5. Islands, or parts of islands that form part of Queensland and are not owned by the Commonwealth, are not part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

6. The information displayed is held in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Geospatial Data Library. This includes data provided by Geoscience Australia National Mapping Division (including the GEODATA product) and the Australian Hydrographic Office. Land tenure was derived from data supplied by the Queensland Department of Natural Resources, Mines and Energy. number of each zoned area. Zones numbered on this map:

CP - Conservation Park Zone
B - Buffer Zone
SR - Scientific Research Zone
MNP - Marine National Park Zone
P - Preservation Zone
